

Make the most of your

careers interview

Your careers adviser is looking forward to meeting you, and helping you move forward with your next career or education decision. They won't be telling you what subjects you should take or job you should do, but will help guide you towards self discovery and decision making.



In your Morrisby account make sure you have **completed** your assessments and questionnaires.



Write down at least **one thing** you would like to get out of the interview.

In **My Choices > Destinations > Options at 18** favourite any subjects that appeal to you, and search for related degree courses or apprenticeships.



Interact with your suggested careers and subjects in the **"My Choices"** area; favourite some or bin others.

What can I do to prepare?

Look through your **"About me"** results and consider if they were as you expected.



Prepare for your interview by completing the Background and Review areas in **Locker > Careers Interview & Meetings > Careers Interview**, so your adviser can find out more about you before you meet.

What will happen during the interview?

- > Your adviser will go through your assessment and questionnaire results with you to find out how accurate you think they are.
- > They'll find out about how school is going, discuss your favourite subjects and talk about your interests.
- > You'll discuss your current situation, what you are thinking about doing and where you are in making your next decision.
- > It doesn't matter whether you know what job you want to do or not, you and your adviser will talk about your career suggestions and ideas.
- > You might discuss apprenticeships, further and higher education or going into the workplace.

Anything else?

It is a confidential conversation between you and your adviser.

Your careers adviser is a qualified, independent careers professional, which means they will not promote one job or route over another and want to help you realise your full potential.
