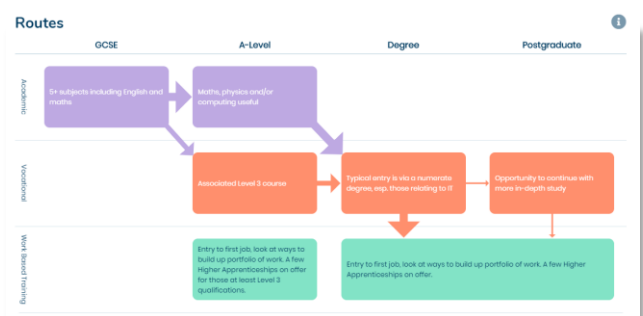
Overview
These engineers work in energy production and specialise in a particular area, such as fossil (oil or gas), nuclear or renewable and sustainable (wind, solar, wave, biofuel etc.). The work they do depends on the area that they work in. For example, in the oil and gas industries, energy engineers calculate how much oil or gas a potential site holds and how it is to be extracted. Engineers are involved in the design and development of machinery and equipment to extract or absorb different types of energy that also meets environmental standards. When they investigate new ways of producing energy, engineers work closely with other professionals.

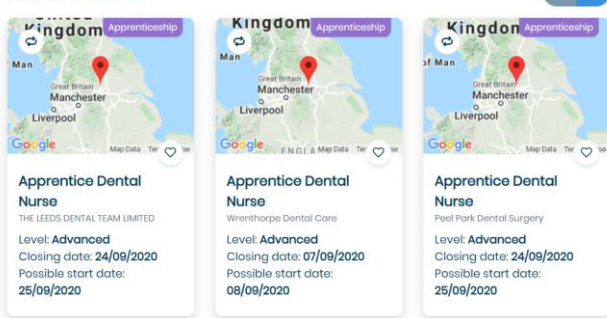

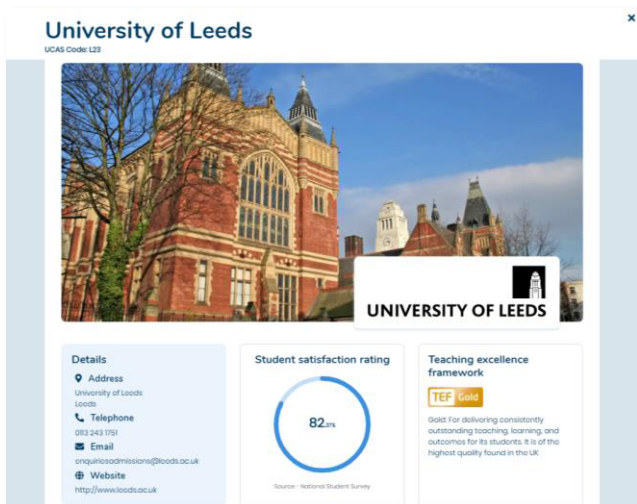
Morrisby Careers also helps with subject choices at all major decision points.

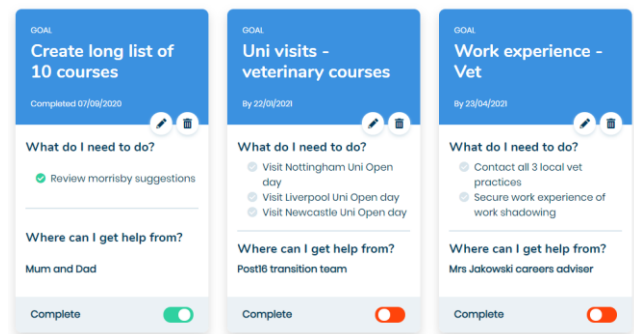
