Investigate degree courses

(for students without a Morrisby account)

This activity is designed to help you investigate the subject you chose in the worksheet **Choosing a degree subject**. Your research will identify specific courses you could apply for. Your first step is to access a list of courses in your chosen subject(s) on TheUniGuide website. On the homepage, enter your preferred subject into the **Search for courses** box. Once the course list displays you can sort and select the filter options if you wish. For any specific course in the list select the course title to click through to the course details, find out about:

- Entry requirements
- The course and its content
- More about the institution (location, accommodation etc) from the full university profile
- How previous students have rated the course in data from the National Student Survey
- Employment prospects

Record your findings, for each course, by answering the questions that follow. You can investigate up to six courses in this activity.
